Diploma in Aromatherapy Training

Aims and objectives

The NZQA Level 6 Diploma in Aromatherapy comprises of 3 elements, theory, practical and case studies. It is a one year full time training programme held in Nelson, NZ.

The main aim of the IFPA accredited NZQA Level 6 Diploma in Aromatherapy is to enable candidates to provide treatments for the purposes of relaxation and stress release with massage and essential oils.

It also aims:

- To provide skills at Level 6 in the NZ National Qualifications Framework for those interested in the Complementary Therapy/Care industry.
- To provide skills at Level 3 in the ITEC National Qualification Framework, UK.
- To provide opportunities for candidates to develop a range of skills and techniques, personal qualities and attitudes essential for successful performance in employment as an Aromatherapist.

The candidate will study the theory of Aromatherapy treatments as well as the Chemistry of the Essential Oils, Contraindications and safety data for each oil, and will also cover the underpinning knowledge and skills required to successfully perform various Aromatherapy massage treatments.

The next Diploma in Aromatherapy class begins on the 20th Feb 2012 and ends on the 9th of November, 2012.

How to staircase into the Diploma in Aromatherapy

The Aromascience course structure has been based on the same information as the NZQA, ITEC & IFPA Diploma in Aromatherapy.

The only difference is that advance massage techniques are not taught, nor is the Anatomy & Physiology in the Aromascience correspondence course. The Chemistry component is the same as the Diploma in Aromatherapy, and is the Rosemary Caddy Chemistry, (UK). Aromaflex has bought the rights to use this information, and it is the most current up to date, student friendly chemistry that you will ever find.

Requirements for undertaking the Diploma in Aromatherapy

- Study and complete the Aromascience correspondence course.
- Study and complete the Anatomy & Physiology correspondence course.
- Enrol on the Holistic Massage course, and come to Nelson for 2 weeks over a 1 year or 2 year period and complete the workbook and in class hours.
- Complete and Pass ITEC exams in Diploma of Holistic Massage

Delivery of the qualification

The Aromascience and Anatomy & Physiology can be studied full time concurrently over 1 year.

The Diploma in Holistic Massage can be concurrently studied at the same time in the same year, or the following year.

Certificate in Aromascience

Aims and objectives:

The main aim of the NZQA Level 4 Aromascience Certificate is to enable candidates to provide knowledge and application of aromatherapy oils and

products for the purpose of relaxation and stress release by treating the whole person.

It also aims:

- To provide skills at Level 4 in the NZ Qualification Authority for those interested in the Complementary Therapy/Care industry.
- To provide opportunities for staff in the Complementary Therapy/Care industry to gain a Level 4 qualification.
- To qualify candidates as Aromatologists at Level 4 in the Complementary/Care industry
- To sustain the interest of candidates wanting to work in the Complementary Therapy industry
- To encourage knowledge and understanding for the Complementary Therapy/Care industry at Level 4
- To provide opportunities for candidates to focus on the development of the major Key skills and the wider Key skills in a Therapy context such as communicating with clients, working with others and problem solving.
- To provide opportunities for candidates to develop a range of skills and techniques, personal qualities and attitudes essential for successful performance in employment as Aromatologists, (the study of Aromatherapy without massage).

Requirements for undertaking this qualification:

It is recommended that Candidates have a good level of English.

Guided Learning Hours:

It is recommended that you attend at least one Introduction to Aromatherapy workshop during your study of the Aromascience course, (this cost is included in your fees).

If you have already done something similar, please provide evidence of this.

Structure of the qualification:

The Certificate in Aromascience course is a distance learning programme, made up of four stages.

- **Stage 1:** Comprises Introduction to Aromatherapy and Stage 1 Aromatherapy – this covers 30 essential oils and 10 carrier oils, Methods of Production, Extraction & Safety, the Olfaction Process & how oils are absorbed into the body, the History of Aromatherapy, The Art of Blending, Recipes, Application Methods, etc.

- **Stage 2:** 20 Essential Oils and 10 Carrier oils, Chemistry of essential oils and how this relates to their use and properties, The Art of Blending, Recipes, Application Methods, etc.
- **Stage 3:** 20 Essential Oils and 10 Carrier oils. Research component – conducting research for a journal article, The Art of Blending, Recipes, Application Methods, Aromatherapy for pregnancy and woman’s needs, etc.
- **Stage 4:** 20 Essential Oils and 10 Carrier oils, The Art of Blending, Recipes, Application Methods, Aromatherapy cosmetics/lip balms/face creams, etc.
- Workbooks and Case study work to be completed.

Description

The foundation course for complementary therapy. The course provides students with a thorough understanding of anatomy and physiology of the body so that they have a complete knowledge structure and functions of

each area on which they are working. The course includes holistic massage incorporating the classical movements treating the whole body. This can be an option to staircase into the Diploma in Aromatherapy.

Diploma in Sports Massage

Rationale for ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Sports Massage

Aims & Objectives

The ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Sports Massage has a pre-requisite of the ITEC Level 3 Holistic Massage Diploma. It is then comprised of ITEC Unit 27 Sports Massage. There are 3 elements– theory, practical and case studies.

The main aim of the ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Sports Massage is to enable candidates to provide treatments for sports injuries and help improve athlete's performance through pre and post event massage.

The candidate will study the theory of all treatments as well as additional anatomy in particular the origin and insertion of muscles. The underpinning knowledge and skills required to successfully perform a Sports Massage treatment are also required.

Case studies are also required to be completed for this award. The case studies form the internal assessment and should be assessed throughout the training by the tutor using the ITEC Case Study Guidance sheet. The case studies are then verified by an ITEC Examiner at the end of the course during the visit for invigilating the practical examination. The case studies ensure that a variety of clients must be consulted and treated in all the above areas and the outcomes of the treatments must be documented in order to gain experience of working with a variety of clients and conditions whilst candidates are still under supervision. Detailed rationales for the type of Sports Massage treatment and outcomes must be shown, as well as after care.

This award qualifies graduates to operate their own clinic or home visiting practice. Graduates can also gain employment in Health Club, Health Farms, Spas and Liners. Professional indemnity and public liability insurance can be obtained via ITEC Professionals and other Industry Associations who recognise the ITEC Diploma.

Certificate in Anatomy and Physiology Correspondence Course

Aims and objectives:

The Anatomy & Physiology award is the 'foundation' upon which all other Complementary, Beauty and Sports Therapy awards are based.

It is comprised of 12 units encompassing all systems of the body.

It is essential for therapists to have a sound understanding of anatomy and physiology, as they will be working in direct contact with the body structures. It is also vital that they have a comprehensive knowledge of diseases and disorders of the human body so that they are aware of when and when not to treat a client, and only operate within certain parameters.

The units are mandatory and should be taught concurrently to be examined concurrently:

- Unit 1: The Chemistry of Life & Pathology
- Unit 2: The Cells, Tissues and the Skin
- Unit 3: The Skeletal System
- Unit 4: The Muscular System
- Unit 5: The Nervous System
- Unit 6: The Human Senses
- Unit 7: The Endocrine System
- Unit 8: The Circulatory System
- Unit 9: The Lymphatic and Immune System
- Unit 10: The Respiratory System
- Unit 11: The Digestive System
- Unit 12: The Urinary & Reproductive Systems

The examination is as follows:

- A 3 hour written exam theory paper comprising of around 40 questions on all aspects of the syllabus testing across all units and therefore all systems. This exam can be either taken at Aromaflex Academy, or you can sit the exam anywhere in or out of NZ, as long as Aromaflex Academy has evidence and confirmation that the exam is held under the correct conditions, (see the Anatomy & Physiology enrolment brochure for further details).
- The ITEC exam is a 1 hour multiple choice theory paper comprising of 50 questions on all aspects of the syllabus testing across all units and therefore all systems.

The Qualification Aims:

- To provide skills at Level 4 New Zealand National Qualifications Authority Framework for those interested in the Aromatherapy, Beauty, Complementary and Sports Therapy industry.

- The Anatomy & Physiology syllabus is based on Core Health, NZQA unit standards. It can also be cross-credited for 1st year at Massey to enter other health modality based training courses.
- The syllabus is based on the International Federation of Professional Aromatherapists (UK), and is an independent stand alone International qualification. This is the only Anatomy & Physiology course of its kind in Australasia.
- To provide skills at Level 3 in the National Qualification Framework in Great Britain, (ITEC), (UK).
- To encourage knowledge and understanding for the Complementary, Beauty or Sports Therapy industry at Level 4 (NZ), Level 3 (UK).

The qualification is suitable for:

Any adult returnee with a good basic general education, returning to education with a desire to work as an Aromatherapist, Reflexologist, Massage Therapist for which the A&P award is a pre-requisite.

Anyone already working as a nurse or carer who may wish to become a complementary therapist as the A&P is a pre-requisite qualification to many other awards.

You can start your study at any time. The date of payment is considered the first start date.

Diploma in Reflexology Course

The NZQA Level 5 Diploma in Reflexology comprises of Level 3 ITEC units:

- Anatomy & Physiology , Reflexology, Professional Conduct and Business Awareness

The main aim of the NZQA Level 5, ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Reflexology is to enable candidates to provide treatments for the purpose of relaxation and stress release by treating the Reflex areas in the feet, hands and ears. It also aims:

- To provide skills at NZQA Level 5 and ITEC Level 3 in the National Qualification Framework for those interested in the Complementary Therapy/Care industry.
- To provide opportunities for staff in the Complementary Therapy/Care industry to gain a Level 5 qualification.
- To sustain the interest of candidates wanting to work in the Complementary Therapy industry
- To provide opportunities for candidates to focus on the development of the major Key skills and the wider Key skills in a Therapy context such as communicating with clients, working with others and problem solving
- To provide opportunities for candidates to develop a range of skills and techniques, personal qualities and attitudes essential for successful performance in employment as Reflexologists.

**WITHDRAWALS, REFUNDS AND STUDENT FEE
INDEMNIFICATION POLICY**

The New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) recognizes that students studying at private training establishments (PTEs) do not have the financial backing of Government that exists with publicly owned tertiary institutions.

Because of this, NZQA has set two requirements within its Quality Assurance Standard for PTEs (QA Standard One) that relate specifically to the protection of student fees. The requirements are contained in element 1.2.1 of QA Standard One and reads as follows:

1. Operating trust accounts that comply with s236A of the Education Act 1989

This requirement protects the student when they choose to withdraw from the course or PTE within the timeframe set by the Act.

Under s236A of the Act, students enrolling in courses of three or more months are entitled to a refund:

- If they withdraw at any time up to the end of the seventh day after the first day of the course at which their attendance on the course is required;
- Equal to the full amount paid, less 10% of those payments or \$500, whichever is lesser.

Private training establishments (PTEs) must without delay place fees paid for courses of three months or more into an independent trust account. These payments, whether described as fees or otherwise, may only be released to the establishment after the eighth day that students are required to be in attendance on the particular course.

2. Having arrangements to indemnify student fees or evidence of exemption NZQA requires that a PTE has arranged the protection of student fees in the event of insolvency, regulatory closure or withdrawal of accreditation-that is, in circumstances beyond the student control-or has an exemption from the requirement. The arrangement (or exemption) put in place by the provider must be approved by NZQA. Any changes to the arrangement or circumstances under which the exemption was granted must be reported to NZQA.

CODE OF PRACTICE FOR THE PASTORIAL CARE OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

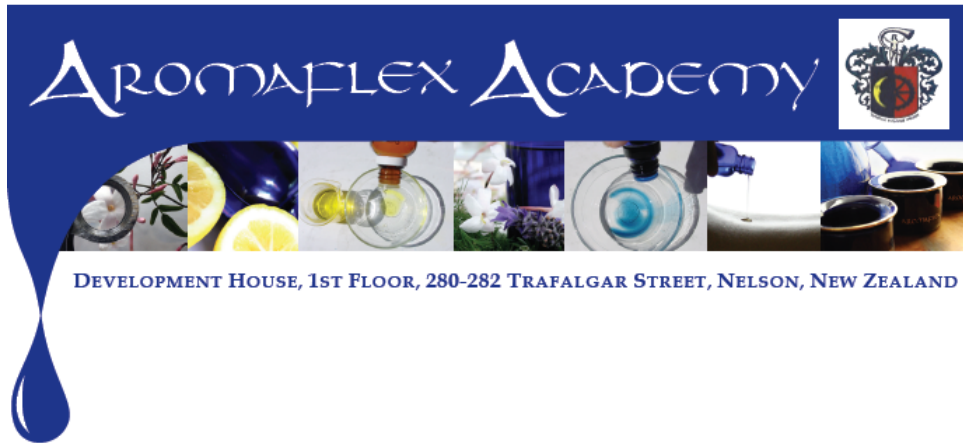
